Spotlight – Community Circus Paisley

Community Circus Paisley are a Community Interest Company founded in 2021 with an aim to provide a permanent, community-owned home for the Scottish circus community, including a circus school and a development/performance venue as well as space and opportunities for the local community in Ferguslie Park.

The group has converted the former St. Ninians Church into a place where people of any age and ability can learn circus skills such as unicycling, aerial acrobatics and juggling.

The group runs classes for children, adults and for people with a range of support needs.
